Apprenticeships allow you to LEARN and EARN at the same time, and your job training is linked to a specific job role in the workplace - so you are training for a job that exists.

Employers must pay you the apprenticeship wage, which is currently £4.15 an hour. However, many employers choose to pay more.

THERE ARE 4 LEVELS OF APPRENTICESHIPS:





NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP SERVICE

This is a good place to start to find out the different apprenticeship careers available and the employers offering apprenticeships.

By creating an account you will be alerted to new opportunities in your area as soon as they are advertised.

You will find many roles advertised which will be new to you. Do you know what a Fenestration Installation Apprentice does? (They install on-site windows, doors, bi-fold doors, and conservatories, made of PVC-U, aluminium, steel, timber or composite).

The entry requirements for apprenticeships do vary depending on the employer, so always check that you have the required qualifications, skills and qualities.

Take time to read the job description carefully, pick out the skills and qualities asked for, and tailor your application to demonstrate you have these attributes, by giving examples from school or college, work experience, clubs, and activities outside of education.

Be prepared for the employer to follow-up your application with online tests (eg numeracy, literacy, situational judgement), and in the current climate a telephone or video interview. Practice and preparation will give you confidence and help you to succeed with these different methods of assessment and interview.








Activate your account

Then you are ready to return to the sign-in page of 'Find an apprenticeship' www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/signin








Or use 'Browse' if you want to see what apprenticeships are available in different job categories.

Find an apprenticeship

Use the **Keyword** search if you know what apprenticeship you are looking for, eg Early Years Practitioner, Business Administrator, Bricklayer.

Ensure you choose the right level of apprenticeship based on your current qualification level: for example, to study for a Higher or Degree apprenticeship you will need to have achieved a Level 3 qualification.




